Mission Statement

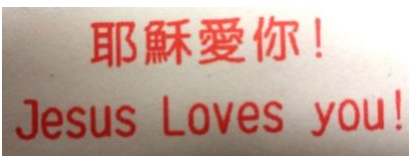

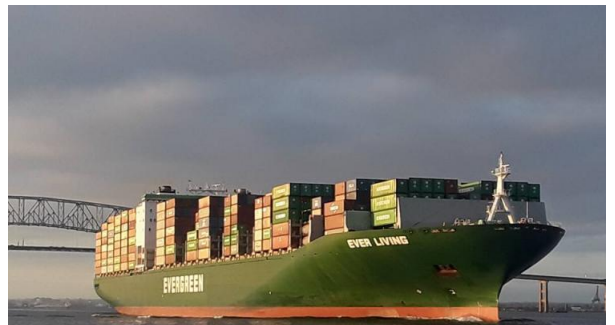


1. More loving laborers in the harvest field with a variety of language skills.

Opportunity for the Gospel Answered

Before we reported that the ship "Ever Living" was in port. Two weeks later the ship "Ever Lasting" called in our Port of Tacoma. Now an opportunity!



What's the difference between Ever **Lasting** and Ever **Living**? The crew in the van shook their heads. As far as the ships are concerned they are both over three football fields in length and can hold the same number of containers.

The crew needed a Gospel explanation of living and lasting. Ever **living** means there is no beginning and no ending. Ever **lasting** means there is a beginning point (birth) but no ending. Only God is forever living. People are everlasting.

Let's pray that the seafarers will commit to the ever living One, Jesus, so they can have everlasting life in heaven with Him.
